Annwyl Riant

Ysgrifennwn atoch unwaith eto i ofyn am eich cydweithrediad os ydych yn cludo eich plentyn/plant i'r ysgol mewn car.

Fel Pennaeth rwy'n gofidio'n flynyddol am sefyllfa iechyd a diogelwch ein plant pan fyddant yn mynd a dod o'r ysgol mewn ceir. Mae'r safle, yn enwedig ar ddiwedd y dydd, yn orlawn ac nid oes lle gennym i ddarparu cyfleusterau parcio ar gyfer rhieni. O ganlyniad mae'r holl geir sy'n cyrraedd yr ysgol cyn 3.45 yn achosi pryder mawr. Rydym wedi ymgynghori gyda swyddogion diogelwch y Sir a chyda'r heddlu ac mae hwythau hefyd yn pryderu am y canlynol:

- Ceir sy'n cyrraedd y safle pan mae'r ysgol dal wrth ei gwaith. Does dim ffordd gwybod pwy sydd ar y safle ac i ba bwrpas, ac mae hynny'n fater diogelwch difrifol.
- Ceir yn cael eu gyrru llawer yn gyflymach na'r 10 m.y.a. sy'n cael ei ganiatáu.
- Ceir wedi parcio mewn mannau amhriodol ar lwybrau cerdded sy'n gorfodi plant i gerdded ar yr hewl.
- Ceir sy'n anwybyddu'r system unffordd.

Ateb syml, ond costus fyddai gosod 'barrier' ar draws y fynedfa a fydd yn atal rhieni rhag cael mynediad i'r safle tan 3.45. Byddai hynny'n gostus ac yn achosi anawsterau i staff, disgyblion a rhieni. Felly, cyn ystyried gwneud hynny, apelïaf yn daer arnoch chi unwaith eto i beidio â dod i gasglu eich plentyn/plant tan ar ôl 3.45y.h. Byddai hyn yn caniatáu i fwyafrif disgyblion yr ysgol i adael y safle'n ddiogel cyn i geir rhieni gyrraedd. Hoffwn eich hysbysu hefyd bod hi'n arferiad erbyn hyn i gwmnïau yswiriant i gysylltu gydag ysgolion mewn achosion damwain i ganfod a oedd hawl i'r cerbyd fod ar y safle a'i pheidio. Mae'r llythyr hwn, felly, yn cadarnhau nad ydym yn dymuno i chi fod ar y safle i gasglu eich plentyn/plant tan ar ôl 3.45 y.h.

Dros yr haf hefyd, rydym wedi peintio croesfannau diogel i'r disgyblion a staff i groesi'r ffordd. Gofynnwn i chi bwysleisio i'ch plant, taw dim ond ar y croesfannau diogel y dylent groesi'r ffordd y tu fewn i safle'r ysgol.

Dear Parent

We write to you once again asking for your co-operation if you are a parent bringing your child/children to school by car.

As a Head I am seriously concerned about the health and safety of pupils as they make their way to and from school in cars. The site, especially at the end of the day, is full and we simply do not have the space to accommodate parking for parents. As a result the volume of cars entering the school at the end of the day is of great concern to me. We have been in discussions with the Local Education Authority and the police who have also expressed concern about the following:

- Cars who arrive at the campus during school time who's occupants or intentions are not known to the school. This is a serious health and safety concern.
- Cars being driven far in excess of the 10 mph speed limit on campus.
- Cars parked inappropriately on school paths, thus forcing pupils to walk into traffic.
- Cars ignoring the one-way system.

A simple, yet costly solution would be the installation of a barrier preventing access until 3.45pm. This would be most inconvenient for pupils, staff and parents as well as a financial burden during difficult times. Before considering this course of action, I would like to appeal to you as parents collecting your child by car to wait until after 3.45pm before entering the school campus. This would allow the majority of our pupils to leave the school safely at the end of the day before parents arrive in their cars. I would also like to remind you that insurance companies frequently contact schools when accident occurs to enquire whether the vehicle involved was authorised to be on private school property at the time of the incident. This letter therefore confirms our wish that you do not drive into the school campus until 3.45pm.

Over the summer, we have painted zebra crossings to ensure that the children and staff cross the road safely. We ask you to emphasize to your child, that they have to use the zebra crossings when they cross the road within the school campus.

Thank you for your support; I'm sure that you understand that my aim is to ensure the safety of our children, and it is not the schools intention to make life difficult for all concerned.
